An analysis and practical study with special emphasis on church discipline, Christian liberty , the resurrection of Christ , and spiritual gifts .

- B. demonstrate the uniqueness of each book;
- C. identify and give the various interpretation of the major "problem" passages in the books;
- D. demonstrate the role of each book in formulating a truly Christian life-style;
- E. show the importance of the books to the body of doctrine;
- F. apply these principles of Christian living in cross-cultural settings.
